These samples are accompanied either by their respective mathematical or chemical formula (See the periodic table on the poster). This menu-card found in Austria in a restaurant called 'Tokyo Bay', has 20 different menus sheets showing these images. The 80 other interchangeable plates are loose in the box, so you can make your daily menu... If one scans a number marked on the colophon of the box one can find all the images used to produce the 100 plates, and also, - a work in progress- each formula marked on the 'periodic table' will correspond in the near future with a film/documentary. This project by Inga Erdmane was made during résidence at SÍM (the Association of Icelandic Visual Artists) in Reykjavík in 2014.

In Iceland, geothermal power is the primary source of home and industrial energy, and aluminium plants require a lot of "juice" and thermal energy fits to this need perfectly. Already now aluminium smelting is the most power-intensive industry in Iceland. At the moment three huge plants are in operation. Two more to go. It's quick money, but there is a serious price-tag attached, in small unfriendly letters.
